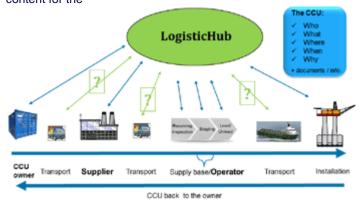
Robert's motto is to create results through combining peoples' skills and stakeholders' satisfaction.
